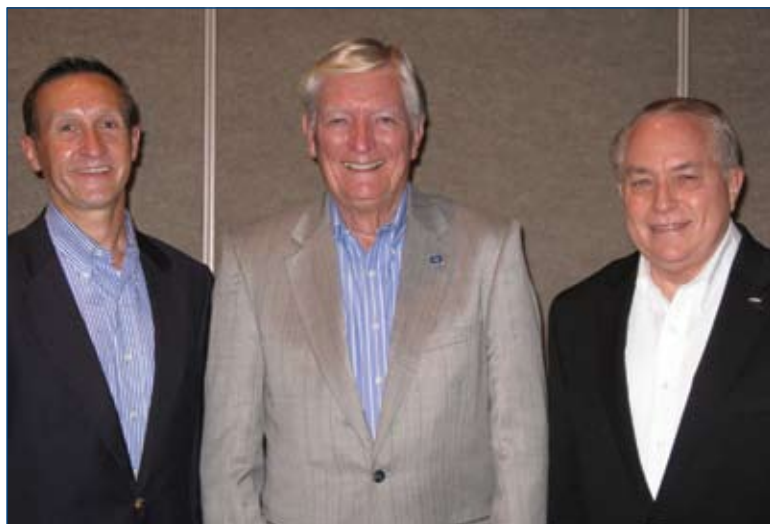
Scholarships awarded to 82 students; includes a new four-year award

Eighty-two students, including children and grandchildren of Supply Corps officers and Supply enlisted personnel, were awarded Navy Supply Corps Foundation scholarships for the 2011-2012 academic year. The Navy Supply Corps Foundation Scholarship Selection Board met in April in Athens, Ga., to make the selections.

This year has been a series of firsts for our Scholarship Program. In order to make a better comparison between applicants, the Board evaluated high school seniors against high school seniors and college students against college students, instead of evaluating them all together. Also, the Foundation began awarding multi-year scholarships with the goal of awarding mostly multi-year scholarships in the future. Finally, the Board then awarded the first CAPT William and Frances Scott Scholarship in Honor of RADM Andrew A. Giordano, a four year scholarship valued at \$50,000,

Capturing the history of the Navy Supply Corps

The Navy Supply Corps Foundation is undertaking an effort to update and document the history of the United States Navy Supply Corps. The historical documentation has been undertaken before; in the 1930s, again in the 1950s, and in the mid 1990s, RADM Frank Allston, SC, USN (Ret.) published a book titled *Ready for Sea* which documented much of this previous research and added many interesting personal stories and the significant events of our proud history. *Ready for Sea* is available for sale through the Foundation's Ships Store. Much of his work was based upon personal stories obtained by interviews with Supply Corps officers.

The Foundation has, or has access to, much of this documentation.

RADM Allston's book, as well as the previous research into our history will serve as a starting point. During the first phase of this project, we want to collect as much pertinent information as possible. Historical data points such as the numbers of Supply Corps officers on active duty at any one time, the number of ships, the number of aircraft, the number of shore activities, etc., will be sourced from official Navy records. Of course, we have access to old issues of *The Navy Supply Corps Newsletter*, *The Oakleaf*, and publications through the Navy History and Heritage Command.

to Ms. Madison Surdyke, daughter of CDR Terry Surdyke (see profile on page 8).

The selection board carefully screened 162 applications during the three-day meeting. Applicants were ranked on scholastic ability, character, leadership, and financial need. The names of the applicants were blacked-out on the application in order to remove any bias in the selection process.


A total of \$228,500 was awarded. Fifteen were multi-year scholarships while 67 were single-year scholarships. Of the 82 recipients selected this year, 44 are currently attending college and 38 will be entering college or university for the first time. There were 52

females and 30 males selected, with 88 percent being from the officer community, and 12 percent selected from the enlisted community.

The Foundation will also fund five one-year \$2,500 memorial scholarships for the children of Supply Corps officers who died while on active duty. Since 1971, the Foundation has awarded 1,942 scholarships valued in excess of \$3,900,000.

CDR Jack Evans, SC, USN (Ret.), NSCF Chief Staff Officer, served as Recorder.

Funding support for community gatherings approved

RADM Heinrich currently serves as Commander, Fleet and Industrial Supply Centers (COMFISCS). RADM Heinrich holds a bachelor's degree in Engineering from the Naval Academy and master's degrees in Business Administration and Petroleum Management from the University of Kansas. He is also a graduate of the Kellogg Graduate School of Management Advanced Executive Program.

He has served in a wide-range of key leadership positions, afloat and ashore. His ashore assignments include Naval Supply Depot Subic Bay; Commander Naval Air Force staff; U.S. Pacific Fleet staff; the former Naval Aviation Support Office; Naval Information Systems Management Center; Naval Air Station Whidbey Island; Commanding Officer, Naval Petroleum Office; and Force Supply Officer, Commander Naval Surface Forces.

Greater Cleveland SCA starts small; working to grow

The Greater Cleveland Supply Corps Association, with less than a dozen identified members, may well be the smallest Supply Corps Association. But the leaders there are working hard to help GCSCA reach its full potential.

CAPT Allan Stanczak, President of GCSCA, knows first hand that sometimes Supply Corps Associations start out small and grow. Previously stationed at Scott Air Force Base, Stanczak was one of a small group that became plank owners of the recently established and growing St. Louis Supply Corps Association.

Stanczak credits past President CAPT Todd Friedlander with getting the organization started, and serving as its leader for the past six years. When Friedlander retired, Stanczak agreed to take over GCSCA.

Today there are five active duty officers at Defense Finance and Accounting Station Cleveland. In addition, there are several active reservists who live in the area and a small group of retirees who work as civilians at DFAS. The closest other activity where Supply Corps officers are stationed is DLA Columbus, which is nearly three hours away.

One of the challenges Stanczak faces is what he calls "the tyranny of distance." Those members who work in Cleveland may live in suburbs that are some distance apart, creating a long drive to a potential after work activity. It creates a challenge for event planners wanting to bring members together.

Scholarship profile

Madison Surdyke earns Foundation's first \$50,000 scholarship

Madison Surdyke, the daughter of CDR Terry and Shai Surdyke, is the first winner of the Foundation's Captain William and Frances Scott, SC, USN (Ret.) Scholarship in honor of RADM Andrew A. Giordano, SC, USN (Ret.). This scholarship is awarded to the Foundation's highest ranking high school applicant, based on academic performance, character, leadership and financial need and is \$50,000 over four years.

A graduate of Fleming Island High School in Florida, Madison is headed to the University of Florida in the fall. She served as Senior Class President and was voted "Most Likely to Succeed" by her class of more than 600 students. Her numerous awards include being named an Advanced Placement (AP) Scholar as well as several outstanding achievement awards.

While her father was deployed to Iraq, Madison was a main caregiver for her grandfather, who lived with the family and was diagnosed with

Alzheimer's disease. Her letter of recommendation noted that "she helped her mother and sisters make certain that all his personal needs were met with the highest of standards."

Madison was born in Virginia and the family moved numerous times before settling in Florida for their longest tour. Her older sister Lauren is also a Foundation scholarship winner and will be a senior at the University of Florida this fall. The two plan to share an apartment in Gainesville.

She is planning to study biology or biochemistry and while she knows it is too soon to be certain, she says she may work towards a career in medicine.

When she learned she had received the scholarship, Madison says "I couldn't believe it! I had to read the letter five times and I was shaking with goose bumps. It was a good feeling! The scholarship will help so much, she says. "It makes it so much easier on my parents. I won't have to be so worried

Supply Corps raises \$10,000 to support “Face of America” bike ride

Over the past few months, a team made up of Supply Corps personnel has worked to raise awareness and funds, and participate in the 2011 edition of the “Face of America” bike ride. The Face of America bike ride spanned two days (16-17 April 2011) and included 500 riders of which 90 were Wounded Warriors now living with disabilities incurred as a result of our most recent wars in Iraq and Afghanistan.

Team Bike Navy successfully supported and completed the ride for the third straight year and provided over \$10,000 to offset the costs of Wounded Warrior participation.
