With the guiding principle of "Taking Care of Our Own," the Foundation Board of Directors has approved a long range "Blueprint for the Future," focused on the following key areas:

Regional Chapters

More than 30 chapters worldwide serve as the face of the Foundation to its members. Chapter activities promote camaraderie between active, retired, reserve, and former members of the Supply Corps as well as providing opportunities for professional and social networking among members and their families. Wherever a handful of Supply Corps officers live, a chapter may be formed.

Recognition

The Foundation recognizes Distinguished Alumni each year, with a goal of honoring retired and former Navy Supply Corps officers who have distinguished themselves by obtaining significant success in the public or private sector. Recognizing the achievements of both individual members and chapters and the impact they have on the Navy and their communities is an important new component of this program. All have the same purpose – to identify those who have made a difference in the roles in which they serve.

Scholarships

Over more than 40 years the Foundation has awarded over \$4 million in scholarships to more than 2,100 dependents and descendants of our members and of current and former enlisted supply personnel. Scholarships are awarded on a competitive basis and may be named after major contributors to the Foundation. In addition, Memorial scholarships of \$10,000 are given to the minor children of Supply Corps personnel who die while on active duty. Member support is vital for this key program.

Communications

Anchored by the organization's flagship publication, *The Oakleaf*, the Foundation is guided by a strategic plan designed to promote robust communications among and between the Foundation, its chapters and members. Key to this effort is the Foundation's website www.usnscf.com and those of its chapters. In addition, social media tools such as Facebook, LinkedIn and Twitter provide connections for enhanced and timely dialog and communications.

Heritage

Since 1795 the Navy Supply Corps has served this nation in war and peace. The Foundation supports several programs designed to help communicate to the larger audience the vital role of the Supply Corps as it serves the Navy, both afloat and ashore. A display program is growing, in both ashore and afloat museums, including aboard the Midway in San Diego. A traveling exhibit program has begun with a focus on the Supply Corps role in the Vietnam conflict. More venues are being explored in both areas. The Foundation is also producing a coffee table book designed to communicate the history of the Supply Corps and the Navy Supply System.
