Supply Corps Internships Fall 2023

Supply Corps internships provide an early opportunity to gain insights and experience in our core competencies. These internships provide exceptional junior officers with a comprehensive introduction to the interconnectivity between the systems and processes that deliver lethality and readiness to the warfighter.

Competition for these coveted internships is fierce. Endorsed applications to the following programs are due no later than 30 September 2023 to supply_corps_cc@navy.mil:

Business Enterprise Management (BEM)

Interns gain experience in Systems Applications and Products (SAP), Navy Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP), Program Management, and Life Cycle Logistics, enabling the Navy to capitalize on emerging technologies to improve supply chain processes. Successful interns receive 24-months of acquisition experience credit.

Business Financial Management (BFM)

Interns receive a broad range of experience across financial planning, budget formulation and execution, contract management, contractor financial analysis, and cost analysis. Successful interns receive 24-months of Financial Management acquisition experience credit.

Integrated Logistics Support (ILS)

Interns receive a broad range of experience across supply chain management, training support, test and evaluation, provisioning and maintenance. Successful interns earn credit for a Supply Chain Management experience tour.

Joint Operational Logistics (JOL)

Interns gain experience across the spectrum of joint operational logistics. Key insights include learning how to manage logistics at the various levels of war, and a deeper understanding of the logistic roles and responsibilities of the services, combatant commands, combat support agencies, and multi-national/interagency organizations. Successful interns will gain experience working on the CNO and Joint Staff.

Navy Acquisition Contracting Officer (NACO)

Interns obtain experience in a wide variety of contracting functions to include planning, cost analysis, negotiation, award, and administration. Successful interns earn credit towards a certificate in contracting/contracting management.

Operational Logistics Planning (PLAN)

Interns gain broad knowledge of logistics planning and theater-level joint logistics, to include insights at all levels of war planning. Successful interns earn credit for an operational planning tour and graduate from the Maritime Operational Planner Course (MOPC) or similar program.

Petroleum Management (POL)

Interns obtain a wealth of operational energy experience across fuel operations, quality assurance, maintenance management, fuel automation systems, dispatching, and scheduling. Successful interns will earn credit for a fuels experience tour.

Warfare qualified officers (O1-O3) with a Projected Rotation Date (PRD) between April 2024 and April 2025, who either have or will have completed one operational tour are eligible for consideration.

LTs (O3) will be considered if participation in an internship will not affect their career progression prior to zoning for promotion to O4. Officers submitting an application agree to complete a 24-month internship and remain on active duty for an additional 12-month tour. Officers selected for a POL Internship will complete a 12-month follow-on tour in a fuels billet.
